Liberation of Children

Situation on April 20, 1942 Working Plan

A. Children from 0 to 14 years.

On April 1, 1942 HUNDRED THIRTY FIVE Jevish children were still in the two large camps:

Up to April 20, THIRTY SIX children have been liberated:

A total of THIRTEEN children have been liberated from Gurs and TWENTYTHREE children from Rivesaltes. On April 20, the situation in the camps was the following:

According to the above plan all children, who at the present moment are still in the two camps, will be liberated by June 1st 1942. If this plan can be realized, only those children whose parents prefer to keep them in camp, (such is the case of 7 babies in Rivesaltes) in order not to separate from their children, will remain in interned after the above mentioned date.

B. Adolescents from 14 to 18 years.

On April 1, 1942 TWOHUMDRED FORTY SEVEN Jewish adolescents were still in the camps Gurs and Rivesaltes:

 Up to April 20, we succeeded in liberating TWENTY adolescents from Riveseltes, who were placed to the former home of the Eclaireurs Israelites in Beaulieu. On April 20, 1942 the situation was the following:

The problem of liberating the adolescents is extremly urgent, since the Commissions that are visiting the camps at the present time are involling into the foreign workers companies, not only men between 18 and 55 but also adolescents under 18. Our plan of liberation of these adolescents is the following:

SUMMARY

- 1). During the first 20 days of April, 36 children were liberated, 13 from Gurs and 23 from Rivesaltes.
- 2). The 56 children who remained in Gurs and the 55 children interned in Rivesaltes will be liberated according to the plan "les camps sans enfants" (the camps without children) on June 1st, 1942.
- 3). 20 adolescents have liberated from Rivesaltes between April 1st and April 20, 1942.
- 4). 47 adolescents are still in Gurs and 180 in Rivesaltes. They will be liberated and placed in the various centers (Lestic, Cental, Beaulieu-Eclaireurs Israelites), as well as in the Homes of the Ose, which admit children over 16. According to our plan, about 80 adolescent will remain in the camps on June 1st, 1942 out of a number of 227, who are still interned.
